

## Occult Blood Screening vs Diagnostic Test

	<b>Occult Blood Screening</b>	<b>Occult Blood Diagnostic</b>
<b>Why</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Routine testing for colorectal neoplasm or other gastrointestinal disorders</li> <li>• Further testing may be done if a screening finds a possible abnormality</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Testing to investigate symptoms or a possible abnormality found during a screening</li> </ul>
<b>Who</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• For patients <u>without</u> symptoms</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• For patient <u>with</u> symptoms</li> <li>• For patients whose screening showed a possible abnormality</li> </ul>
<b>Test Method</b>	FIT Test (iFOB) – Hemosure  <b>Do NOT use SENSEA for SCREENING</b>	FIT Test (iFOB) – Hemosure  <b>OR</b> Guaiac test – Hemoccult SENSEA*
<b>Collection</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• One collection only</li> </ul> <b>(use 1 Hemosure instead of 3 SENSEA cards)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• One collection only</li> </ul> Hemosure <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Stool only</li> </ul> <b>OR</b> Hemoccult SENSEA* <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Stool or rectal swipe</li> </ul>

\*SENSEA is less sensitive & has dietary restrictions
